About This Training

The goal of Mental Health First Aid is to teach methods of assisting someone who may be in the early stages of developing a mental health problem or in a mental health crisis and provides useful information on how to assist a person who has a history of a mental health disorder or longer-term mental health problems.

Learning Objectives

Through participation, trainees will be able to meet the following objectives:

1. Define and explain mental health and the impact of mental health disorders; Evaluate the spectrum of interventions for mental health problems and evaluate the list of resources for persons with mental health disorders.
2. Memorize the Mental Health First Aid Action Plan.
3. Recognize the definition of depression and other mood disorders.
4. Express helpful resources for depression, suicidal intentions and non-suicidal self-injury.
5. Identify/define anxiety disorders and the types of anxiety disorders; Express helpful resources for anxiety disorders.
6. Define psychosis and identify the causes; List the types of disorders and helpful resources in which psychosis can occur.
7. Define substance use disorders and evaluate the cause of substance use disorders.
8. Summarize the importance of early intervention for: depression, anxiety disorders, psychosis, and substance use disorders.
9. Memorize the Mental Health First Aid Action Plan for: depression, anxiety disorders, psychosis, and substance use disorders.
